TWO LIBRARY STAFF MEMBERS ASSUME NEW POSITIONS

Linda Divan, who has been the Library's Senior Cataloger for a number of years with some systems responsibilities, has been appointed the *Library Systems Coordinator* in order to better address the growing Library systems needs including technical support and training. Linda's primary focus is on the Library's Innovative Interfaces system, its scope of operational modules, its interface with OhioLINK, and its public presentation through the Library on-line catalog. **Rory Patterson**, who has been the User Education Librarian since 2001, will become the new *Digital Services Librarian* on October 1, this new position being the result of an open position created when Susan Winn completed her service as Reference Librarian last Spring. Rory will address the growing need to support, expand access to, and promote the awareness of the Library's digital resources which now include over 190 on-line databases, over 6,900 on-line journals, almost 20,000 e-books, and almost 2,000 on-line videos. Rory will also especially work with faculty on digital resource training, continue as the *RefWorks* trainer, and maintain his role as the copyright consultant for the Library. The Library will begin a faculty search to fill Rory's current position, now re-titled the *Instructional Services Librarian*. **Tonya Fawcett**, the *Assistant Director for Reader Services*, will be assuming direct leadership of the Library's user education program.

SEVERAL CLASSROOMS RECEIVE UPGRADED MEDIA TECHNOLOGY



Over the summer, the AV Services technical staff upgraded the media technology in a number of classrooms in the **Apple Technology Resource Center** and the **Dixon Ministry Center**. The classroom technology carts in both buildings now use a control system with a master control unit to turn the projector on and off; to change the source from the tech cart computer, a connected laptop, a document camera, a DVD player, or a VCR; and to manage volume control. Handheld remote controls have been discontinued in these venues. Document cameras were installed in two rooms in Apple and two rooms in the Dixon Ministry Center. These cameras can be used to project handwritten or typed text, as well as three-dimensional objects for class viewing. The upgrade in the DMC Recital Hall is similar to the upgrades described above, except the control system uses a touch-screen panel.

MAJOR SHIFT IN OHIOLINK DATABASE PROVIDER CHANGES ON-LINE RESOURCE MIX

As a member of the OhioLINK consortium, the Centennial Library has been able to offer a wealth of research databases. 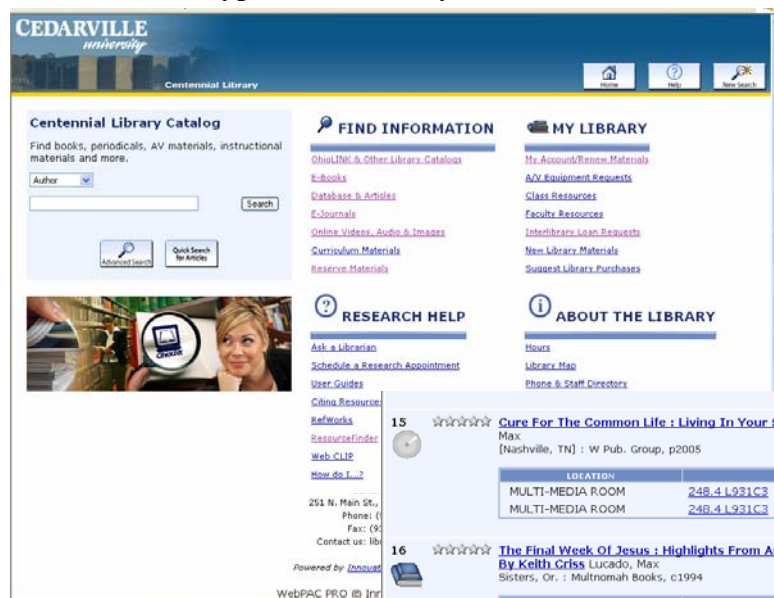

NEW LIBRARY WEBSITE AND CATALOG INTERFACE IMPLEMENTED

The **Centennial Library Catalog** has been redesigned, with lots of new features and tools to make searching easier. Here are a couple of the highlights:

The first page has been simplified to allow for quick searching. The drop down box allows for the selection of the type of search (keyword, title, author, etc.) and the entering of a request in a single search box.



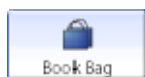
Advanced Search options and **article searches** are only one quick click away.



The **brief record** list now provides the location, call number and

availability of an item, without having to go to the complete record. **Icons** provide a quick way to determine the item type (book, journal, website, DVD/Video, teaching aid, etc.).

The book bag allows for the creation of a list of titles to export, send to e-mail, or save. Batch requests may also be made for items are checked out to another patron.

From the [My Library/Renew Materials](#) link, patrons can store searches, set



up alerts



for new items **[Mark for E-mail]**, keep a record of all the items they have checked out of the library, and share an opinion about an item by rating it.



Another new feature will involve e-mail notifications. For items with checkout periods of 7 days or more, **courtesy notices** will be sent to patron e-mail accounts, providing a reminder of the due date and a link to renew the item. However, once a patron has received an overdue notice, electronic renewal is not available.

Recognizing Faculty Scholarship

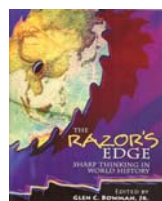


Michael Firmin, *Professor of Psychology*

Newcastle, England: Cambridge Scholars Press, 2006. 216 pages

This publication, edited by Mike Firmin and Patricia Brewer, is a compilation of the papers presented at the 17th annual Ethnographic and Qualitative Research in Education conference held at Cedarville University. The papers in the volume draw attention to many of the themes that are discussed during EQRE sessions and conversations. The contents of the papers explore the theme of interaction and communication in diverse settings, present action research on the improvement of teacher education, and provide a series of projects that examine the instruction of qualitative research methods at colleges and universities. This collection of papers includes one by Mike Firmin as well as one co-presented by Mike and Kevin Sims, *Professor of Political Science*.

Carrying the Torch to Their World

Editor. The Razor's Edge: Sharp Thinking in World History.
Dubuque, IA: Kendall/Hunt Publishing, 2005. 188 pages.

This textbook, edited by Glen Bowman, coordinator of world civilizations at Elizabeth City State University, is intended to promote critical thinking by focusing on the practical points of argumentation. Thus the first half of the book includes a six step guide to evaluating arguments. The remainder of the textbook is a world history reader addressing the most perplexing questions in world history including “timeless” questions and “time-specific” questions. The section on each question includes several readings followed by questions for contemplation and discussion.
