VOLLEYBALL CAMP

July 8–12, 2012

Who:

Volleyball camp is designed for girls who will enter grades 7–12 in the fall. Campers come from all backgrounds — those who have been involved in volleyball for a number of years and those who are just getting started. The camp is geared to handle all levels of skill, and campers are grouped accordingly.

What:

Each camper is involved in a rigorous schedule with competition and instruction throughout the day and evening. Groups are based on age and skill development (junior high, high school, and advanced). The advanced group is limited to 24 spots that are filled on the first day of camp.

Although the schedule is busy, there is time to relax, get to know other campers, and grow spiritually through devotions, Bible study, and prayer time. The staff seeks to provide quality instruction while emphasizing enjoyment and fun as key elements.

Schedule:

Check in between 2–4 p.m. on Sunday in the Doden Field House. The first camp session begins at 5 p.m. Camp concludes at 12 p.m. on Thursday.

Location:

Cedarville University, Cedarville, Ohio

- Games and instruction take place in the Callan Athletic Center and the Doden Field House. The two facilities feature nine regulation volleyball courts.
- Students are housed according to age category in air-conditioned residence halls on campus with counselor supervision. Campers should bring their own bedding and towels.

Cost:

\$320 per resident camper

\$225 per commuter

Fee includes a T-shirt, room and board for a resident camper, and lunch and supper for a commuter.

Campers are responsible for lost keys (\$50) and any room damage.

The following discounts are available and may be combined:

- Two or more campers from the same household: \$10 per camper
- Early registration (before June 17): \$10 per camper
- Campers attending more than one CU sports camp: \$10 per camper
- Alumni children: \$10 per camper
- Sibling of current CU student: \$10 per camper
- Cedarville faculty and staff children: \$50 per camper
- Teams with seven or more players attending: \$15 per camper (Registrations must be mailed together.)

CAMP DIRECTOR: DOUG WALTERS



Doug Walters has been the head volleyball coach at Cedarville University since 2008. Walters' first season with the Lady Jackets was a memorable one as he guided the program to its third National Christian College Athletic Association title in four years. He was tabbed the NCCAA National Coach of the Year and finished that season with a 27–12 record. The Lady Jackets have continued to qualify for the postseason every year of Coach Walters' time at Cedarville. He has coached six NCCAA All-Americans, one NAIA National Player of the Week, seven NAIA Scholar-Athletes, one AMC Libero of the Year, one AMC Freshman of the Year, eight AMC All-Conference players, and two All OIC players.

Walters came to Cedarville from Milford High School, where he coached for two seasons. Prior to Milford, Walters spent seven years building Eastern High School in Sardinia into one of the top Division III programs in Ohio. He was a four-time conference Coach of the Year and saw eight players continue their careers at the collegiate level. Walters was the founder and former director of the Greater Miami Volleyball Club in Cincinnati.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Q:** What residence hall supervision is provided?
A: Team coaches and camp staff will provide supervision in the residence halls. Camper/staff ratio is approximately ten to one.
- Q:** How many students are in each residence hall room?
A: Two students per room
- Q:** Who receives the early registration discount?
A: Campers who register three weeks prior to camp qualify for a discount of \$10 per player.
- Q:** What meals are provided?
A: Resident campers receive three meals per day beginning with dinner on Sunday and ending with breakfast on Thursday. Commuter campers receive lunch and dinner Monday–Wednesday.
- Q:** Are campers busy all day?
A: The schedule for camp is rigorous but includes time for relaxation and relationship-building. A typical day begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 9 p.m. See a sample schedule online.
- Q:** May campers bring electronic games, iPods, or other electronic devices?
A: Students are discouraged from bringing electronic devices. The University is not responsible for lost, broken, or stolen items.
- Q:** May students leave camp for other summer sports activities?
A: Yes, with written approval from the parent or guardian.
- Q:** May parents observe camp?
A: Yes, parents are welcome to watch games. Schedules are available for reference at the start of camp.
- Q:** Should campers bring money?
A: A camp bank will be available on registration day. All money should be put into the camp bank. A concession stand is provided each day for snacks.
