Classroom Utilization

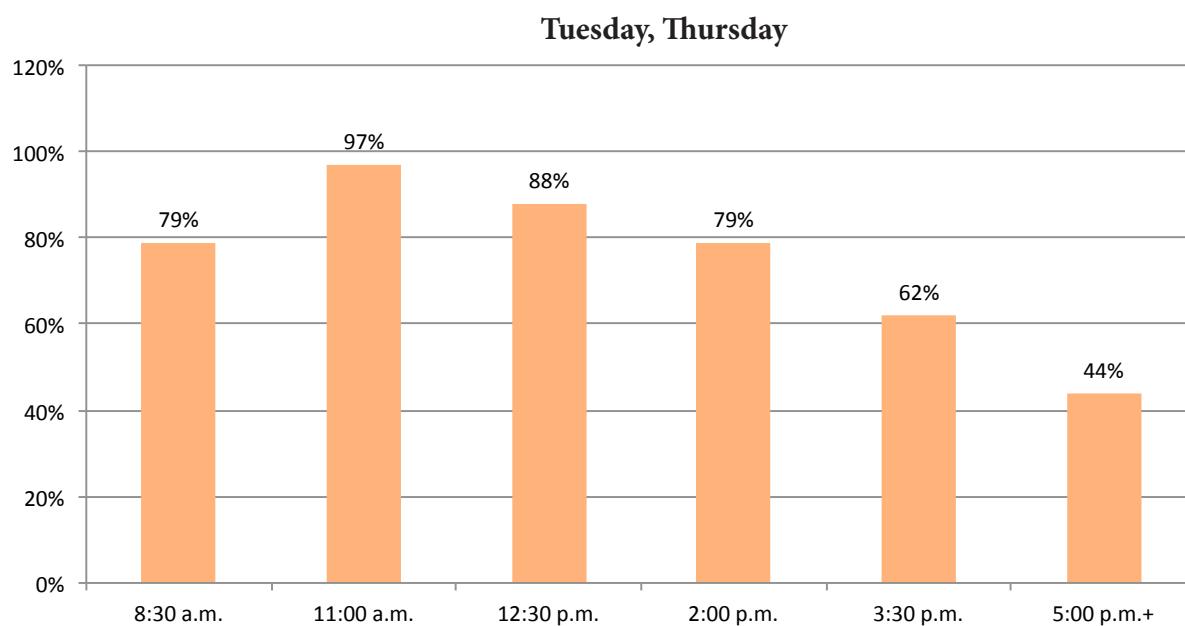
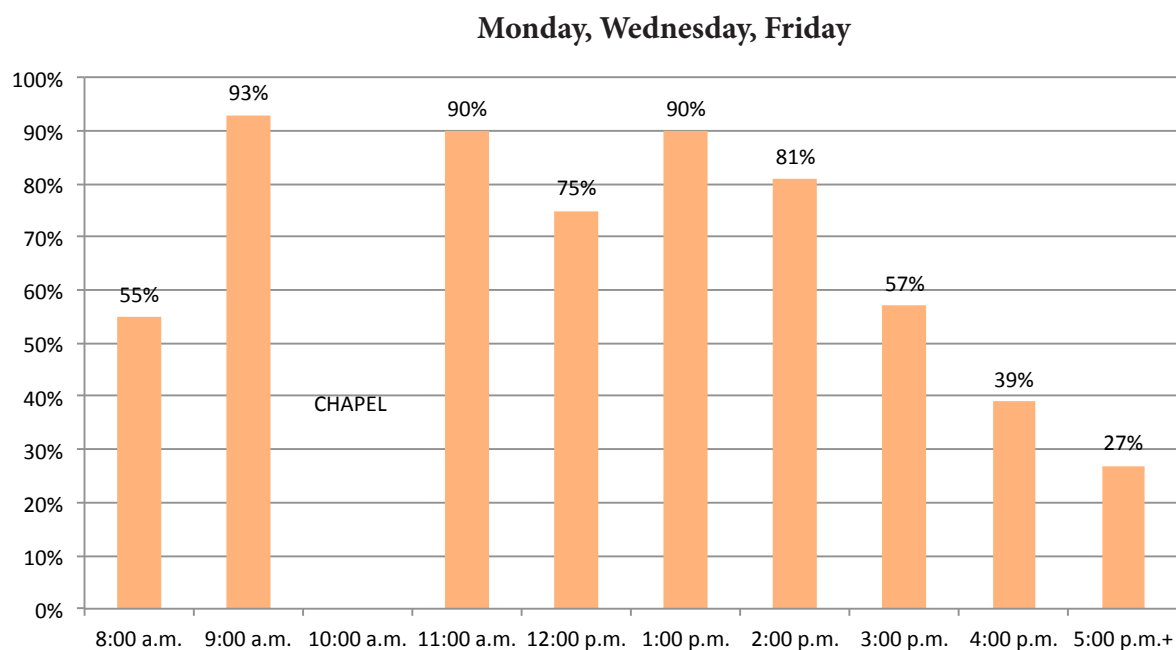

Tuition Hours Sold, Fall Term

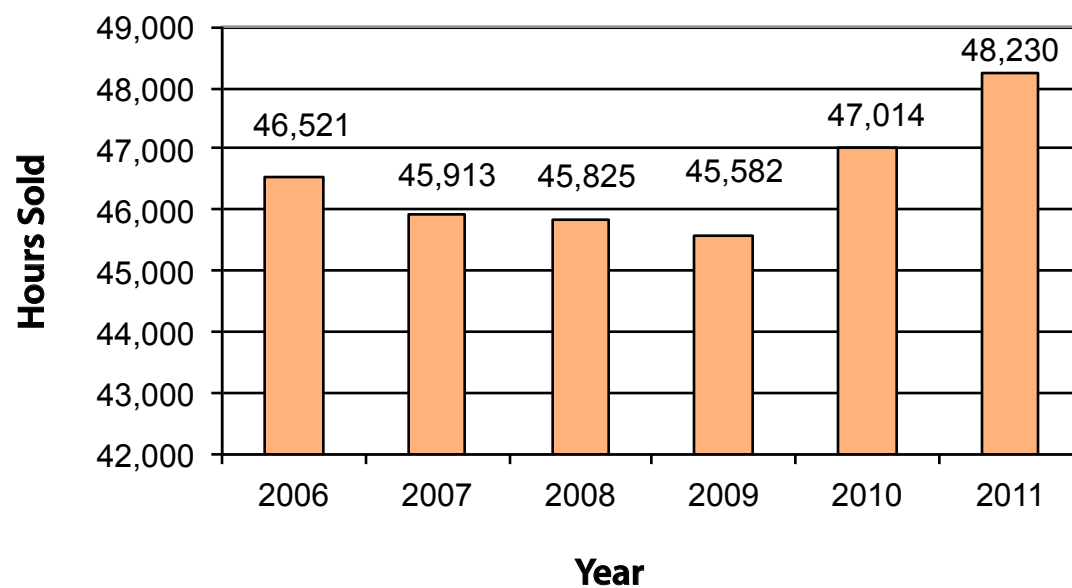
