Wisconsin's Shepherd's Home allows students to work with mentally handicapped adults in hands-on areas like gym class as well as behind-the-scenes in laundry or kitchen duty. Open Door Ministries in Denver invites students to work with them as they seek to meet the physical, emotional and spiritual needs of the Denver community. There are eight different Community Ministries spring break trips, most of them dealing with inner city work or ministering to the disabled.

The focus on these local trips is on local issues. Unlike MIS trips, students will probably not build orphanages or teach English classes. Students might not eat new foods or learn another language. 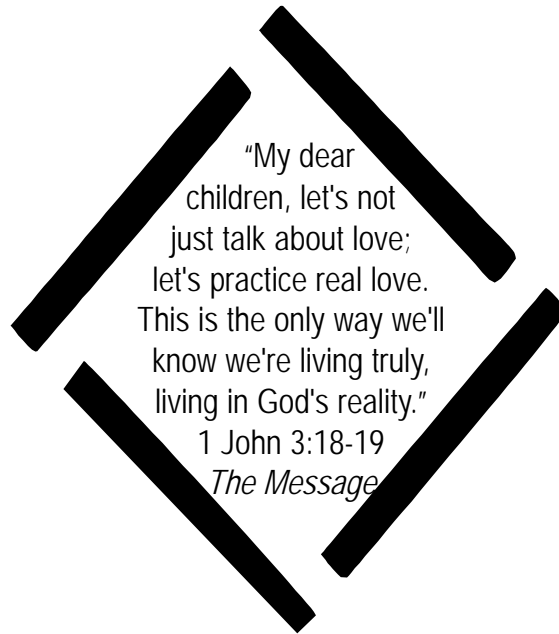
