Non-refundable fee – due Jan. 20	\$ 200
Program fee	\$3800
Tuition (times the number of hours)	\$ 831 per credit hour
Administrative fee	\$ 250
Airfare	TBD

How does billing work?

Your student account will be charged the program fee, administrative fee, and tuition about April 15. Additional charges apply for credits over 17 for the Summer Term. Airfare is not included in these calculations.
