

# Legacy Center Tour

## Directions

Take US-35E towards Xenia

There will be a split in the highway before entering Xenia.

Do not take US-35 Business, but continue on US-35E.

Exit at US-68 (Home Avenue), Turn left off the exit ramp

Travel 0.7 miles on US-68 (Home Avenue)

Turn left on Legacy Way (Tom's Garage will be on your right)

## Tour

- ➡ Continue on Legacy Way, across the bridge and up the hill, **STOP** at the intersection of Wesley Avenue, Mueller Lane and Legacy Way. Collier Chapel will be on your right through the trees.



### #35 Collier Chapel 981 Mueller Lane

The Collier Chapel is one of over 40 historic buildings that occupy the current Legacy Center. Many of the buildings were originally constructed during the late 1800s or early 1900s when over 900 children lived on the 253 acres which made up the Ohio Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphan Home.

- ➡ Bear slightly right on Wesley Avenue, **STOP** at the intersection of Taylor Drive and Wesley Avenue. The three buildings that comprise Xenia Christian School will be on your right (Grades PreKindergarten through 12, the Auditorium and Gymnasium).



### #32-34 Xenia Christian School, Auditorium & Gym 1101, 1075 & 1055 Wesley Avenue

Dayton Christian Schools is a non-denominational Christian school system which has been serving the Greater Miami Valley for over 40 years. Xenia Christian School is one of 3 Dayton Christian campuses which serve almost 2,000 students from 54 school districts drawing families from over 380 churches. <http://www.daytonchristian.com>

- ➡ Continue on Wesley Avenue, **STOP** at the intersection of Douglass Lane and Wesley Avenue. Heart to Honduras and Operation Christmas Child will be on your left side.



**#25 Heart to Honduras & Operation Christmas Child**

1180 Wesley Avenue

Founded in 1988, Heart to Honduras seeks to address both the spiritual and the material needs of the poor in Honduras including: clothing, hunger, housing, healing and hope. <http://www.hth.org>

Operation Christmas Child is an outreach of Samaritan's Purse. This past year, more than 7.6 million shoe box gifts were collected and distributed to children in 95 countries. <http://www.samaritanspurse.org/>

- ➡ Cross Douglass Lane continuing on Wesley Avenue, **STOP** the International School Project will be on your right. Xenia Christian School fifth and sixth graders also occupy this building.



**#24 International School Project**

1185 Wesley Avenue

The International School Project equips and sends teams to countries all over the world. Teams ventured to Guatemala, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Russia and the Ukraine in 2006.

- ➡ Continue on Wesley Avenue, **STOP** at the intersection of Knox Lane and Wesley Avenue. A satellite station of WFCJ radio will be on your left.



**#31 WFCJ Radio station 93.7 FM**

1200 Wesley Avenue

In 1961, WFCJ (which stands for Witnessing for Christ Jesus) began broadcasting from a two-car garage. With primary operations based in Miamisburg, Ohio, this satellite station was opened a few years ago on the Legacy campus. WFCJ provides listeners with both inspiration and information 24 hours a day.

- ➡ Continue on Wesley Avenue, turn left onto Wycliffe Drive. Continue on Wycliffe Drive and **STOP** at the corner of Tyndale Lane and Wycliffe Drive. Joni and Friends (Wheels for the World) is down the stone driveway at the back of the building on your right.

One of the newest ministries to join the Legacy campus is the Wheels for the World Dayton distribution center. WFTW aims to meet the physical and spiritual needs of the disabled around the world by providing wheelchairs and sharing the love of Jesus Christ. WFTW has distributed over 25,000 wheelchairs to over 60 countries through 2004.

- ➡ Continue along Wycliffe Drive which will curve gently left and then right. **STOP** before the road bends sharply to the left. The Legacy Village Assisted Living Center will be on your right.



**#14 Legacy Village Assisted Living Center**  
695 Wycliffe Drive

The Legacy Village Assisted Living Center recently opened and provides housing in 22 assisted living apartments. Apartments are single or double occupancy and have 24-hour emergency monitoring. Dining and group activity areas are available within the building.

- ➡ Wycliffe Drive becomes Moody Drive which curves sharply to the left. Shortly after crossing Luther Drive **STOP** and view the Legacy Retirement Village on the right.



**#66 Legacy Retirement Village, Community Center & Sales Office**

The primary purpose of this village is to enable mentoring and ministry among all ages from children to seniors. A community of 63 single-floor patio homes has been specifically designed for senior independent living. Homes are available in either duplex or single-family configurations.

- ➡ Continue on Moody Drive, passing the Browne Family Retreat Center (on the left) which is operated by Athletes in Action. Bear left on Taylor Drive, **STOP** at the intersection of Elliott Drive and Taylor Drive. The headquarters for Athletes in Action ahead of you and on your left will be the various residence halls used by AIA.



### **#1 Athletes In Action Headquarters**

651 Taylor Drive

Athletes in Action was founded in 1966 and is a ministry of Campus Crusade for Christ. AIA focuses on ministry to college and professional athletes and coaches. AIA uses the many residence halls clustered around the 3-story administrative building to host camps and conferences on the 250 acre Legacy campus. Plans are underway to break ground on a 40-acre, \$5 million sports development later this spring. <http://www.aia.com/>

- ➡ Turn right onto Elliot Drive, **STOP** next to the AXP Museum (on your right.)



### **#38 AXP Museum**

350 Elliott Drive

Although the state of Ohio closed the Ohio Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphans Home in 1996, this museum has continued to be maintained by the AXP (Association of eX-Pupils). The museum contains memorabilia from the classrooms, trade centers and dormitories of the many children and young people who lived here since its founding in 1869. <http://ossoovch.org/>

- ➡ Continue along Elliot, turn left onto Wesley. Turn left onto Taylor (more AIA residence halls on your right). Turn right at the stop sign back onto Elliott again. Turn left onto the continuation of Taylor. Turn right onto Moody. Look for the sign and turn right into the Schindler Banquet Center parking lot **STOP**



### **#2 Schindler Banquet Center**

(straight ahead – back entrance from parking lot)

Formerly known as Amos Hall, the recently remodeled banquet center is named for Legacy Ministries President, Bud Schindler. A venue for wedding receptions, conferences, seminars, camps, retreats, banquets, meals for staff and students, and much more, the Banquet Hall seats more than 650 for banquets or up to 900 for conferences. <http://legacycenter.org/>

- ➡ Go in the entrance under the awning, up the stairs, turn to the left.
